

# Buffalo Headdress Craft

## Materials needed:

Construction paper or neoprene for headdress and horns

Yarn for the buffalo hair

Elastic (or construction paper) for the band around the child's head

Glue

Staples

Scissors

## Directions:

Use pattern to cut headdress and horns out of construction paper or neoprene

Adhere horns to back of headdress using glue

Adhere yarn to front of headdress for the buffalo hair

Measure elastic so the headdress fits around the child's head

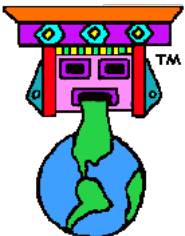
Attach elastic to the headdress using staples

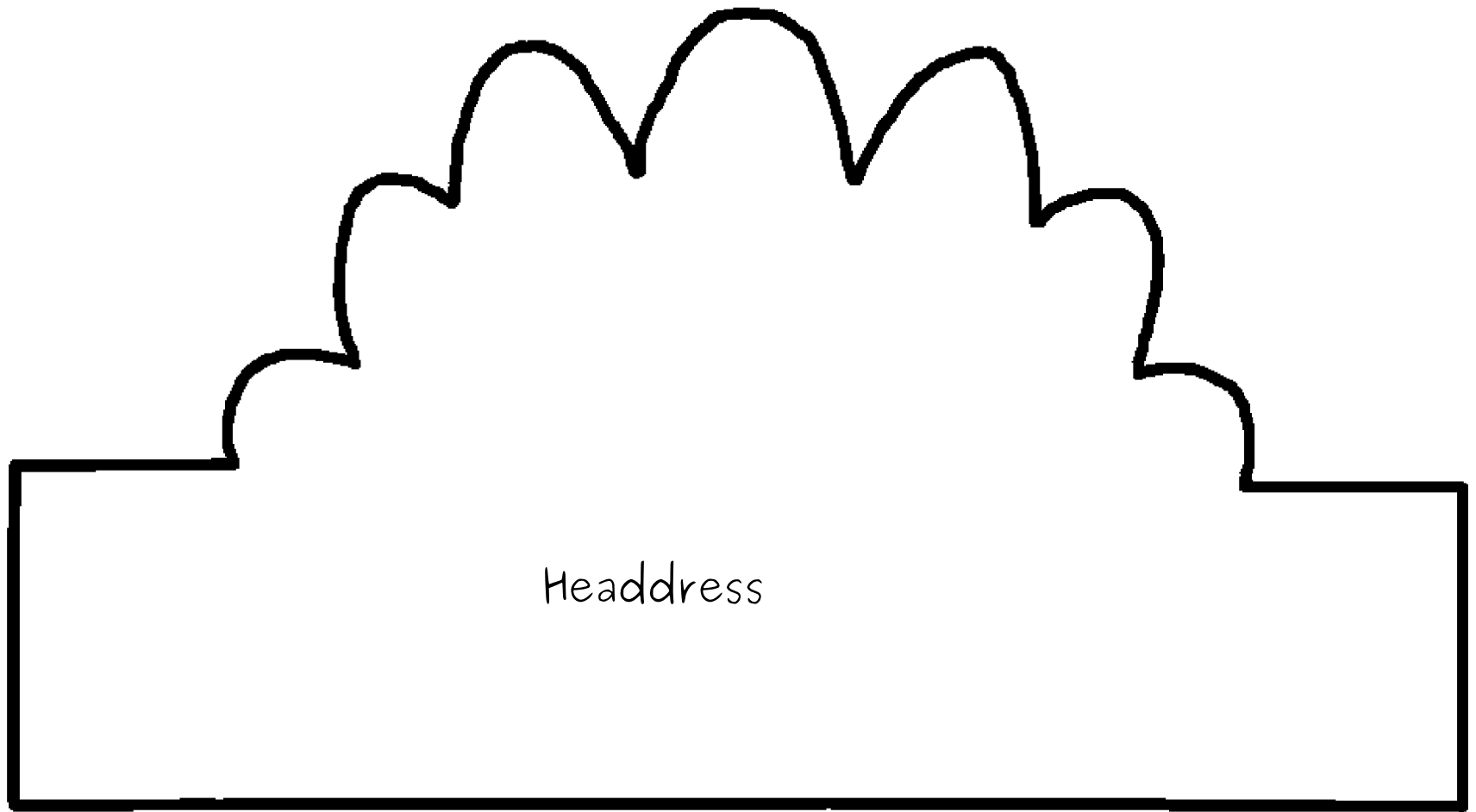

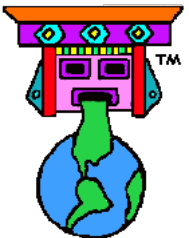
Our craft project was designed to look more like a buffalo. We have included this photo for your reference of what an actual headdress looked like.

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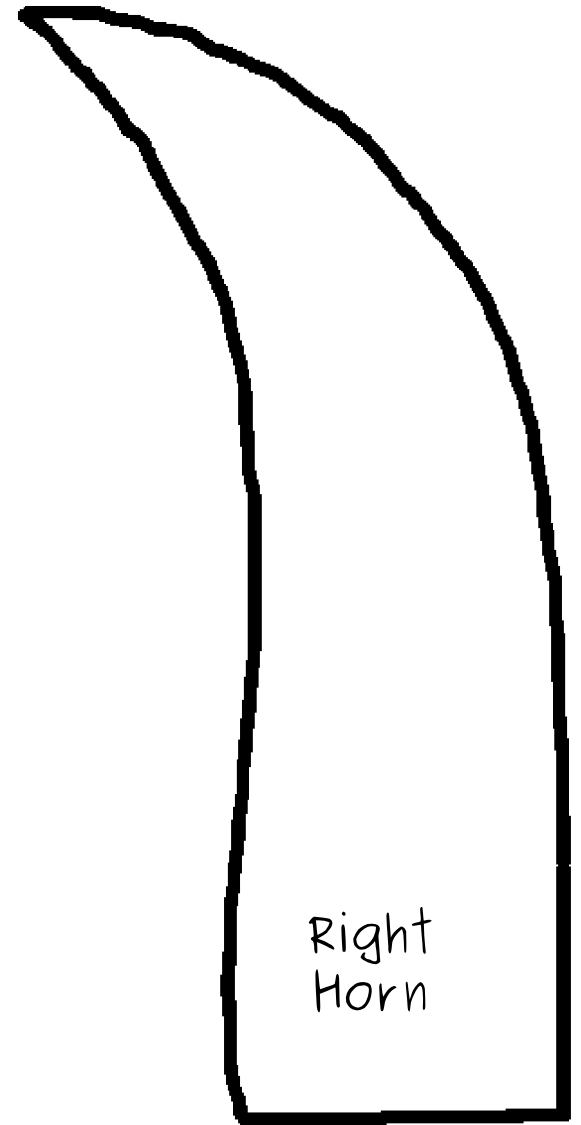


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Left
